

Olds Minor Hockey Association Proof of Residency Documentation Policy

Approved by the board - June 7th, 2022

From the following list we require at least **three (3)** items of supporting documentation to verify residency. **NOTE:** Renting accommodations, paying utilities, and registering for school in a community can be done without establishing permanent residency.

- 1. Utility bill in your name (cell phone bills are not acceptable). Bill must include service address as well as mailing address
- 2. Proof of community school enrollment
- 3. Current GST statement or Income Tax Assessment
- 4. Homeowner/Rental insurance statement
- 5. If moving prior to the start of the season, a signed purchase/rental agreement with possession date
- 6. If moving to a home under construction, a signed builder agreement with possession date.
- 7. Current property tax notice in parent(s) name(s)
- 8. Void cheque with residence address and parent(s) name(s)
- All of the above must have parent(s) name(s) on the documentation.
- ** Any other documentation which supports your claim to residency at the address.
- *** For circumstances not covered by this policy, the board will make decisions on a case-by-case basis.

C(3) of Hockey Canada Regulations

A Player's residence is established by:

- a) The Parents' usual residence when Parents live in the same house; or
- b) In cases where the Player has more than one custodial Parent, each of whom lives in a separate residence, the usual residence of the Parent with whom the Player usually lives. If the Player lives equally with both Parents, his place of residence shall be determined by the Member.

NOTE: the term "usual residence" is defined as four (4) out of seven (7) days.

NOTE Under Hockey Canada Regulation O(3) & Hockey Alberta Regulation B(11.7) Any player found guilty of having falsified Hockey Canada Registration information shall be automatically suspended from playing hockey for any Minor Hockey Association for a period of up to three (3) years.
